# We have built a state-of-the-art campus so that young people no longer need to leave Daventry to access high quality further education.

Our Daventry campus building provides students with access to state-of-the-art equipment and learning resources. The first floor is home to multiple ICT suites. Here you will also find award-winning library facilities, art studios and a science laboratory.

The ground floor is dedicated to a range of other technical and professional learning opportunities. Facilities include motor vehicle workshops, hairdressing and beauty therapy salons and a fully equipped construction workshop.

Also on the ground floor is the cafeteria, student support and enrolment centre and a Supported Learning area for students with learning difficulties and/or disabilities.

On the top floor are our general purpose classrooms for healthcare students and a childcare craft area.

This campus provides places for 400 students, including Apprenticeships, and focuses on developing the skills identified as central to the local economy. An exciting new curriculum has been developed for young people, adults and local businesses.

If you are aged 24 or older you may need to pay for all costs associated with your course. You may, however, be eligible for fee concessions depending on your circumstances and the level of the course. Some Level 3 courses are free under the Government's new Skills Guarantee and Advanced Learner Loans may be available to help pay for other Level 3 or Level 4 courses. Details will be provided at your interview or you can call the Enrolment Centre on 0300 123 2344 for more information.

If you are applying for a University Level qualification (HNC/HND) you can apply for a Higher Education student loan.

#### BURSARIES

Funding is provided to Northampton College by the Government to support students who would otherwise find it difficult to come to college.

Eligibility is based on age, residency, household income and previous level of qualification, although exceptional circumstances will be considered.

#### CHILDCARE COSTS

If you are aged over 20 at the start of your college course and applying to the Student Bursary scheme for help with the cost of childcare you will need to register with one of our approved childcare providers.

If you are aged under 20, you may be eligible for help under the Government's Care to Learn scheme which pays up to £160 per week for childcare with an Ofsted-registered provider while you are at college. You must be in receipt of child benefit for the child or children you are claiming for.

#### HIGHER EDUCATION STUDENT LOANS

Full-time or part-time students can apply for a loan to pay for the tuition fees of a Higher National Qualification through the Student Loan Company.

#### LOANS

If you are 19 or over and are applying for a Level 3 or 4 programme, you may be eligible for an Advanced Learner Loan. You'll only need to start repaying the loan after you've completed your course and once you are earning more than £27,295\* a year. ### **STUDY PROGRAMMES**

When you join the College, you are signing up for more than just a qualification. Your Study Programme is made up of the following:

#### **CORE QUALIFICATION**

You have chosen the subject area that you are interested in and we will make sure you are working at the right level and are challenged to achieve the highest level of qualification you can.

#### **WORK EXPERIENCE AND EMPLOYABILITY**

When it comes to getting started in the career of your choice and securing the right job, we want our students to stand out from the crowd. You may get the opportunity to take part in work experience placements that will help you adapt to the world of work.

You will get involved in sessions that cover CV writing, interview skills, finding employment, time management, money skills and personal development to build your confidence. You will also get to meet local employers when they come into college as visiting speakers or as part of industry visits to business venues.

#### MATHS AND ENGLISH

Everybody needs maths and English skills in their everyday life as well as in the workplace, where employers expect a good standard in both before they will offer you a job.

All students will continue to improve their maths and English and if you don't have a grade 4 (C) at GCSE, we will work with you to help you achieve this.

#### **INDUSTRY PLACEMENTS**

Industry placements are an integral part of the T Level courses which are being introduced at Northampton College from September 2022. They will provide students with a valuable opportunity to develop their practical and technical skills in a role directly relevant to their course.





#### FOUNDATION PROGRAMMES

If you are unsure what you want to do, or need to improve your entry qualifications, our one-year full-time Foundation Programme provides an ideal starting point, enabling you to progress through to further levels of achievement. As well as working on a range of work-related projects you will also study for qualifications in English, maths and digital skills.

#### LEVEL 1 QUALIFICATIONS

These introductory qualifications will provide the perfect stepping stone on to BTEC or equivalent qualifications at Level 2 and above.

#### **ASPIRE**

This innovative and supportive study programme enables you to concentrate on improving your maths and English GCSE grades, alongside building wider skills. Maths and English forms a large part of your week as you'll have extended support to wrap around each of your classes, which will help you to develop and demonstrate confidence in each aspect of the GCSE programmes.

You'll keep building wider skills with these additional elements to your programme. Our Personal Journey module focuses on confidence, resilience, self-esteem and independence, alongside broadening your study skills.

You'll also work on a City and Guilds Award in Employability Skills at Level 2 - this focuses on accrediting your progress in the skills you need for work, including confidence, resilience, self-esteem and independence. You will then be able to demonstrate and grow these further in our work experience programme.
